

## Concept of hygiene and safety for partial classroom instruction at the MHB during the winter semester 20/21

- Students will be assigned to fixed groups for the duration of the entire semester and in accordance with teaching formats and requirements.
- A maximum number of persons to be admitted has been assigned to each MHB classroom.
- Rooms for small groups are not available for instruction but may be used for breaks or as work space by a maximum of three persons within the fixed group.
- Students and teachers directly enter and leave the classrooms immediately before and after lessons.
- Everywhere on campus, students and teachers keep a distance of at least 1.5m from each other and wear face masks during classroom instruction.
- Disinfectant dispensers and disposable masks are available in all classrooms.
- Additional regulations for specific teaching units (e.g. internships, practical exercises) will be communicated in time; the MHB will provide the required gloves, FFP3 masks, face covers etc.  
Maximum length of lessons is 2:15h. Classrooms must be aired every 30 minutes (air exchange by draught).
- Attendance registers are obligatory.
- Students must disinfect contact surfaces (tables, chairs, doorhandles switches, pens etc.) after each lesson (paper tissues and disinfectants are available in each classroom) and air the room for at least 10 minutes.
- All students and teachers a) with symptoms possibly associated with SARS-CoV2, b) with contact to persons with a confirmed COVID-19 infection in the last 14 days, and/or c) who returned from a risk area within the last 14 days prior to the class, are requested not to attend.

- We recommend that you keep a list of your contacts to ensure a quick response if required.

Students and teachers who belong to a high-risk group are requested to decide for themselves whether to attend classes, and to supply additional, personal and individual protection themselves.

The Section Curricular and Student Affairs directed by J. May will coordinate, implement and monitor the safety concept in regular consultation with MHB virologist Prof. Hufert.
